PAX Good Behaviour Game

Now we've settled into the year, you may have noticed your children talking about PAX. The PAX Game combines all the skills of self-regulation your child has been building with their teacher's use of PAX GBG strategies throughout the year. The PAX Game involves your child working as part of a team to create PAX (peace, productivity, health, and happiness) in the classroom. When their team and others achieve that PAX and avoid problematic or off-task behaviours, everyone wins a Granny's Wacky Prize of fun and celebration together. The PAX Game is the most proven classroom-based prevention strategy. Encouraging children to make good choices for themselves and everyone else while avoiding negative choices builds self-regulation that lasts a lifetime. Research has shown the self-regulation that comes from the PAX Game to improve test scores and graduation rates – and even reduce drug addiction, violence, and psychiatric disorders when children reach adulthood.

Here are some areas of growth you will notice in your child right away:

- They will work better as part of a team.
- They will improve their focus on the task at hand.
- They will avoid problematic choices and behaviour.

Here are some lifetime skills that your child will develop:

- They will make positive choices for their futures and the futures of others.
- They will actively avoid distracting, harmful, or dangerous behaviours.
- Here are some questions you can ask your child about the PAX Game:
- Where did you get to play the PAX Game today? How did it go?
- What prize did everyone get?

Opportunity Class- Year 5 in 2026 & Selective High School- Year 7 in 2026

Are you planning on applying for a child to sit the Opportunity Class assessment for Year 5 in 2026 or for the Selective High School assessment for Year 7 in 2026? If so, please pay attention to the following and act with urgency. Applications for selective high school and opportunity class entry in 2026 will remain open to THIS FRIDAY 21 February 2025. There will be no late applications due to the longer application period, and the application closing date being closer to the test dates and logistical constraints around organising test centres and devices. Parents and carers need to apply for opportunity class placement when their child is in Year 4. For selective high school placement, parents and carers will continue to apply when their child is Year 6 until the end of this week.
